THE SCHOOL

Woodlawn High School is a four-year, public, comprehensive high school serving approximately 1,800 students. The school has received accreditation from the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and by the Maryland State Department of Education. Woodlawn High School is also a member of the College Entrance Examination Board and the National Association of College Admissions Counselors.

Woodlawn High School offers a variety of instructional programs to meet the needs of the student population. They include: an Honors/Gifted and Talented Program, an Engineering magnet program (Project Lead the Way), Cooperative Career Development Program, Special Education, AVID, Advanced Placement, and Naval Junior R.O.T.C.

Woodlawn High School is located one half mile east of exit 17(Security Blvd.) off the Baltimore Beltway I-695, at 1801 Woodlawn Drive.

Pre-Engineering Magnet Program

The Magnet Program provides students with highly competitive college preparatory curriculum in grades 9-12. Students who are interested in the various fields of applied mathematics, science, or engineering will find a challenging four years of required and elective subjects geared to match their interest.

THE COUNTY

Baltimore County is located in the industrial, cultural, and commercial center of the Mid-Atlantic States. In its 610 square miles are found diverse land and water forms, neighborhoods, economic conditions and life styles. It is the 24th largest school system in The United States.

THE SCHOOL SYSTEM

Baltimore County contains no incorporated cities or towns and its public schools are organized into a single system that serves approximately 106,000 students in grades K-12. This makes the Baltimore County School System the twenty-fourth largest school system in the country. Upon graduation, eighty percent of the students enroll in two or four year colleges.

THE FACULTY

The professional staff at Woodlawn is composed of over 100 teachers. All are certified in their specialized curricular areas. A majority has earned Masters Degrees and credits beyond the Masters level; many have Doctoral degrees.

Gifted and Talented and/or Honors courses are offered in English, Social Studies, Mathematics, Art, Science, Music, Career and Technology Education, Foreign Language, and Family Studies.

Class Rank: Class rank will be computed for every high school student by dividing the total number of quality points accumulated by the total number of credits attempted. Students will also be ranked on the basis of an unweighted grade point average. Class rank and Grade Point Average lists are produced quarterly.

TESTING PROGRAM

Students at Woodlawn may elect to take a variety of college entrance tests. Testing packets include: SAT I, ACT, ACT Writing, TOEFL, Advanced Placement, and SAT II. Woodlawn High School's CEEB code is 210-225. Woodlawn is a testing site for every SAT and ACT administration.

GRADUATE PROFILE

Eighty percent of recent graduates pursued post-secondary education at four-year colleges and community colleges. Graduates also pursue employment after completing career and technology programs in business, marketing, accounting, graphic arts, food science and nutrition, child development, and by completing advanced technology offerings in communication, radio and television, power and energy, and manufacturing.
